

COURSE TITLE **Walking in the Editor's Shoes: Peer reviewing and journal editing for young researchers in health sciences (all disciplines)**

Course Description

Early career scientists (late-stage PhD students, and postdocs) are involved in manuscript peer review as authors and reviewers. As reviewers they influence what is published, and need to understand the full decision making process. The course offers theoretical background and practical training in evaluating manuscripts at all stages of peer review, from pre-screen to final decision, in the roles of reviewers, handling editors, and editors-in-chief. We offer interactive lectures, single studies and supervised group work, and use examples from the real world of an interdisciplinary public health journal to perform a wide range of hands-on exercises.

Learning Goals

The course concentrates on the tasks and responsibilities of reviewers and editors. Participants will learn pre-screen and peer-review criteria, will train to write concise and useful reviews, evaluate revisions, take decisions on manuscripts and communicate these. Students will learn best practice standards in scientific publishing, and get to know tools to handle misconduct. They will understand editorial strategies to increase the impact of a journal, and new trends in peer review and scholarly publishing. The course improves reviewing skills and prepares for an appointment as associate editor.
